

When John Burrus and his lovely wife, Tammy, moved to our neighborhood two years ago, it was easy to see that they were friendly and hardworking. For months before moving into their new home, they worked weekends and nights remodeling the interior and beautifying the exterior, doing most of the work themselves. Then they rebuilt their deck, which became the envy of all who saw it. We soon realized that John had talents and skills that many of us lacked: he can build or fix almost anything. But that is not what makes John such a special neighbor. It is the way that he always takes the time to help out with anything that needs to be done.

It would be difficult to relate all the times that he has shown up at our door or gate to repair something, lift a heavy object, or just stop by to see if we needed anything. This past December, John noticed that I was outside struggling to hang Christmas lights. He showed up with his ladder and staple gun and began helping me. Many times after a heavy rain when the canal becomes littered with trash and debris, John and Tammy have cleaned up the area without saying a word to anyone. When the fence that separates the ELE grounds from the park had a large hole that was allowing uninvited guests onto the grounds, John found a way to patch it and thereby make our community more secure. When his home was broken into recently, he looked for ways to make all on our street safer. He personally installed a fence in our yard and provided locks for our gates. Although newcomers to our neighborhood, John and his wife, Tammy, volunteer on two advisory committees that assist the ELE Board of Directors.

Holiday Safety for your fireplace



- Before lighting any fire, remove all greens, boughs, papers, and other decorations from fireplace area. Check to see that the flue is open.
- Use care with "fire salts," which produce colored flames when thrown on wood fires. They contain heavy metals that can cause intense gastrointestinal irritation and vomiting if eaten. Keep them away from children.
- Do not burn wrapping papers in the fireplace. A flash fire may result as wrappings ignite suddenly and burn intensely
- Set up Christmas trees away from the fireplace and keep live tree reservoirs full of water so the tree does not become dry and a fire hazard
