Crime Prevention Update

Unfortunately, we have had several break-ins in ELE over the last several months. We had a very informative meeting with the Arlington Police Department in April, but it is up to us in the neighborhood to be vigilant and watch for crime happening in our neighborhood

What can you do?

- If you see any suspicious activity, please call 911.
- Join the website Nextdoor.com to get neighborhood updates
- Keep your home safe- see the safety tips below.

Safety Tips

Burglaries are often crimes of opportunity. To reduce your risk:

- Get to know your neighbors. Be familiar with the types of vehicles they drive, whether they have out of town guests or if they will be having hired services performed at their homes. This can be one of the best ways to deter crime.
- While many ELE residents are gone during the day, our neighborhood is full of activity. Tell your housekeepers, lawn companies, pool service professionals, etc. to be on the lookout for suspicious activity. For example, on 4/14 the police received valuable information about a suspect from someone who was working at a nearby home. The worker saw a young African American male run and get into an older model white SUV, possibly a Dodge Durango or Ford Explorer. He attempted to follow the suspect to get a license plate number but was not successful.

Never open your door to anyone you don't know.

Trim shrubbery that hides the doors and windows of your house.

Illuminate your yards and entranceways. Consider using motion-

detection lighting.

Keep your doors locked whether you are at home or away.

Keep your garage door closed and locked, even when at home or in the backyard.

Lock your vehicle if it is not in your garage. Never leave valuables in a vehicle in view.

- Half of all home burglaries occur during the day. Be alert to any suspicious persons or vehicles in the area. If anything seems out of place, notify the police to check it out.
- Be observant of repair personnel, construction workers, or service workers who might be thieves. If their behavior or location seems out of the ordinary, notify police.
- Consider installing an alarm and cameras. Monitoring technology has come down in price, and some cameras can be monitored from an app on your phone or computer.
- Take a look around your house and prepare yourself in the unlikely event you are a victim. Take photos of your property for insurance and recovery purposes. Back up your computer files. Download photos from your cameras. Store your backup in a safe location, possibly away from your home. Insurance can replace your devices, but not precious photos and documents.



Nextdoor.com

It's exciting to see so many of you on the ELE site on Nextdoor.com. At this point, 128 of 337 households have joined. If you haven't signed up, I encourage you to do so!

Nextdoor.com offers a terrific opportunity for us to share information about crime, neighborhood events, pool and tennis court information, women's club news, recommendations, ideas about how to improve our neighborhood and more.

One of the benefits of the site is that we all have the opportunity to communicate. We can send news and information to each other immediately.

The ELE site on Nextdoor.com is private. Only residents within our neighborhood boundaries can join our site. You may also participate on the broader "Lake Arlington" site. That includes all of the neighborhoods near ELE, and it is a good source of information as well.

Nextdoor.com is recommended and used extensively by the Arlington Police Department. The crime prevention team posts regularly on site, and they are counting on us to post information they can use to help solve crimes.
