Grounds Report

Fall Suggestions from the Architecture Committee:

With the approach of cooler weather and a possible hiatus from yard work, now is a good time to take a close look at your exterior fence and any landscaping that might be hiding it from your view.

Mature landscaping can wreak havoc on wooden fences: broken pickets, pressure from branches aiding in warping pickets and degradation of support rails. Additionally, residents living on Big Bear Lake Drive, take a walk behind your property and see if there are any low hanging limbs that could obstruct the sidewalk. Remember, there must be a minimum eight-foot (8') clearance for safe passage. We don't want Code Enforcement to come knocking at your door.

For your convenience, the Architecture Approval form is on the ELE website. If you are planning any work that requires pre-approval, please complete the form, attach any required documentation, plans, drawings, etc. and arrange for the forms to be dropped off for approval. The Architecture Committee will review the approval request in a timely manner so work can start as soon as possible. Please refer to the guidelines in the Architectural section of the HOA by-laws for further information.
