While the neighbors have been going about their daily lives, maintenance has been taking place around the clubhouse. A leak in the clubhouse had caused some ceiling damage. The contractor for the recent remodel determined that it may have been done during construction and repaired the ceiling at no charge. Andy Chinchilla also repaired a water line that had been leaking just outside of the clubhouse. His team has also refurbished the columns and guttering at the entrance to the building. The columns really look much better now.

Corrosion and age had damaged one of the tennis net posts. The post has been removed and completely replaced and is ready for tennis players. It involved actually having to remove and replace concrete in the court, but workers took great pride in the work they did.

More repairs are going to be needed on the canal just east of the tennis courts. The rains in the fall undercut the embankment. This has been repaired years ago, but the amount of water and its force was no match. This will be remedied as soon as the water recedes enough to gain access to the problem.

Work is also planned on the gates to the boat dock. Damage to the main gate with the swinging arm has prevented it from opening and closing correctly. The repair for that is in progress.

Mark and Deanna Kratovil are now at 3606 Lake Pontchartrain.


