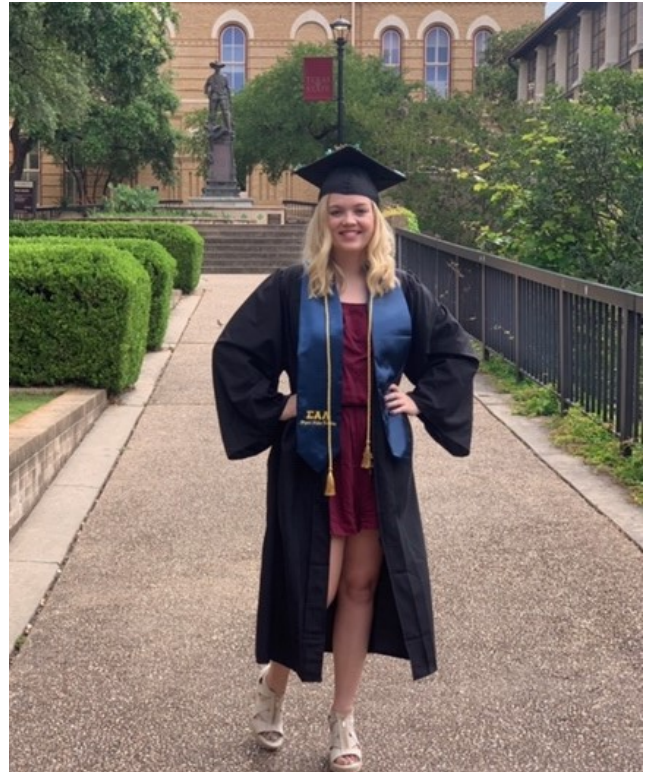


MAY IS FOR GRADUATION.....

EASTER EGG HUNT & PARTY

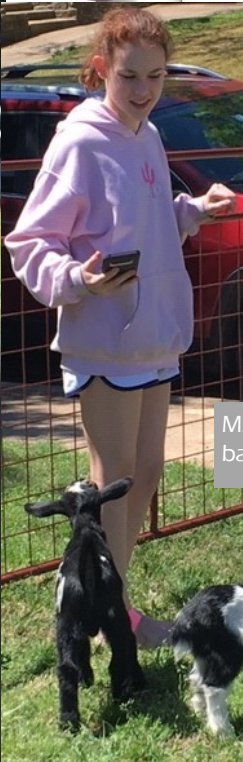
The sun was shining bright and there was a crowd ready to hunt for eggs, take pictures, play with goats and make balloon animals. It was a wonderful time had by all.

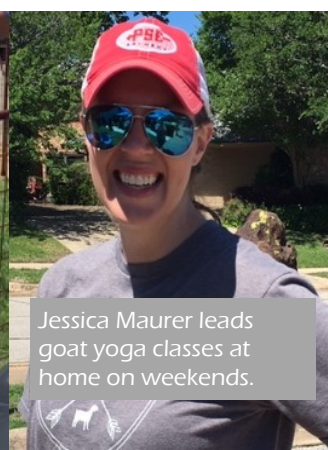
