The upcoming <u>Annual Meeting</u> is fast approaching. We need your participation. If you cannot attend the meeting on September 20 at 5:00 p.m., please complete a proxy ballot and return it to a board member, neighbor or block representative. This year Andrew Piel, City Council member, will be at the meeting to give you an update on several projects, in particular Bowman Springs Park and Poly Webb projects.

This year has been challenging. We recognize the strain and the disruption that this pandemic has caused for every member of our community. It was clear that Covid-19 was going to impact the pool opening. We knew that the normal Splash Day events that we have enjoyed for years was not going to be a reality. The board was instead focused on how we could open the pool safely while following CDC guidelines. Your pool staff worked diligently to ensure that all protocols for cleaning and social distancing were followed and this pool season was successful.

A priority this year was to stop the infestation of egrets that have plagued the neighborhood, and in particular Lake Tahoe, for the last several years. With help from the city and diligence by homeowners the egrets were prevented from nesting this year. We will be alert next year for the likelihood that they attempt to return to ELE — can you blame them, this is a great neighborhood to call home!

There have been significant <u>capital improvements</u> to the neighborhood.

The boat dock ramp was replaced, two new HVAC units wereinstalled at the



tall stems and cones of the Rudbeckia maxima that first appeared in the garden last year, as a lone stem.


This year we were blessed with 7 stalks of the bright yellow flowers with tall brown cones! This plant and the white nightshade behind




YARD OF THE MONTH- September 2020

ELE BOARD OF DIRECTORS' ELECTION

Part of the agenda of the upcoming ELE HOA Annual meeting, is to fill vacancies currently on the board and/or those seats where current members are completing their terms. Please consider taking one of these positions. If you're new to the neighborhood, it is a great way to meet people and get involved. If you're one of the old-timers, then think about getting on the board for the first time, or going for a repeat in a different area.

We need to fill the following positions:

VICE-PRESIDENT: On the ELE board this does not set you up as the next president, so don't let that scare you. It is probably the least demanding job on the board.

TENNIS CHAIR: This position promotes tennis within the neighborhood, whether though classes, tournaments, or parties. Overseeing the maintenance of the courts is also part of this job.

POOL CHAIR: This position is busiest during the summer; coordinating with the Pool Manager to arrange lifeguards and their schedules, scheduling pool/clubhouse rentals, overseeing pool maintenance and servicing.

SOCIAL CHAIR: This position manages the parties and events that can be enjoyed by the entire neighborhood. Specifically those which have become traditional, such as the Easter Egg hunt, Splash Day, and Christmas with Santa. clubhouse, retaining walls at the canal were installed and a new gate at the boat dock has been installed. We are currently looking at the ability and costs to add security cameras at the dock, tennis courts clubhouse and pool.

This year we will begin the process of updating the Bylaws of the HOA. We will need to seek legal counsel in order to facilitate the changes that are needed. The board voted last month to sign a representation agreement with a firm that specializes in HOA compliance law.

The Arlington City Council has determined

that "Champion Great Neighborhoods" is a priority for the work of our City. Great neighborhoods contribute to a higher quality of life and greater investment in our economy. We have been offered an opportunity to apply for the Neighborhood Matching Grant Program. This grant opportunity is a matching grant, which means that we have to put some investment into the neighborhood too. The match requirement can be met with cash, in-kind donations, and volunteer hours. We also need 25% of homeowners to agree

and sign a petition that states you are in favor of ELE applying for this grant. The petition will be available at the annual meeting on September 20th and we will have until November 3rd to collect enough signatures and apply for the grant.

I want to encourage each resident to be involved as much as you are able to be. It is a great way to meet your neighbors while building a strong community. I am honored to serve as your president and I look forward to seeing you around the neighborhood. Mary Lobban, HOA President

ELE BY-LAWS AND COVENANTS

The board has recently been dealing with some issues centered around basic points that are outlined in the <u>By-Laws and Covenants</u> which every home owner receives at their purchase closing. As Mary Lobban mentioned in her remarks, the ELE Board will be looking into updating this document in the coming year..

The most frequent complaint usually has to do with yard upkeep, vehicles parked on the street, or garbage being put out and then left until the next pick-up day.

The ELE Covenants address the maintenance of lawns in *Section 8.0108*. It states, briefly, that each owner is to keep all shrubs, trees, grass and plantings.....neatly trimmed, cultivated and free of trash, weeds....

Section 8.0107 states that no mobile home, trailer of any kind, truck,



camper, boat ...shall be kept...on any property or street within ELE that is visible from neighboring property.

And, Section 8.0110 says no garbage or trash shall not be visible, except to make it available for trash collection and then only for the shortest time necessary to effect such collection.

All of these things, plus the other rules contained in the Covenants work to keep our neighborhood beautiful for us all. Especially now as so many people are escaping the indoors to walk and enjoy the fresh air. And, unlike most HOAs, there are no provisions for action to be taken against offenders of the general rules. We have always been able to work with neighbors, appealing to their desire to be a good neighbor.

One last thought, when the Board decides to update this document, the residents will have final say as to the acceptance of the changes.
