# Grounds Committee

Plants, bushes, trees, warranty work and vandalism; this has been a busy start for the Grounds Committee.

We started the year with the low lake water revealing the poor condition of our newly constructed retaining wall near the tennis court. Some homeowners had also expressed displeasure with its construction. The Board President , myself, and a few homeowners with construction knowledge met with the builder and agreed some warranty work was needed. In December the wall was rebuilt and the canal cleaned-up at no cost to the Association. The builder has also extended the warranty of the existing retaining wall.

Some homeowners have called about the Crepe Myrtle by the main entrance and bushes blocking the walkway around our perimeter. The Crepe Myrtle's size and density causes a blind spot for oncoming traffic and could cause an accident and joggers have to duck under trees and bushes to avoid a friendly slap by an extending branch. Our landscapers have trimmed the main entrance and cut back any perimeter bushes extending beyond the fences. These problems would have gone unnoticed if it not been for a few concerned homeowners—thank you.

We have had more vandalism to the pool area and boat dock. The railings on both have been damaged. A police report was filed and any information regarding the vandalism would be appreciated. These repairs are funded by the Association and use much needed resources. The common grounds are owned by all ELE homeowners, it is our responsibility to keep watch over them.

On a happy note, due to the mild weather we are having, our winter flowers at all three entrances are still looking great. I am still accepting ideas for the spring planting. The Annual ELE clean-up day is scheduled for April and I will be asking for volunteers for tree trimming, leaf and garbage clean-up, and dumpster guards.

### Pool Season Is Almost Here!!!

The 2004 Pool Season is just around the corner. We are very fortunate to have Ryan Storck and many returning lifeguards who will ensure another fun and safe swimming season for all ELE residents and their guests.

As we usher in a new season there are some important changes each family should take note of. Those changes are outlined in the 2004 ELE Directory. Listed below are the more notable changes.

Smoking is not permitted in the clubhouse or the entire enclosed pool area.

Children under the age of 8 years old must be accompanied by an adult 18 yrs or older.

Children under the age of 6 yrs old must be accompanied by an adult 18 yrs or older in the large pool unless they pass a swimming proficiency test.

Lifeguards are paid at the rate of \$15 per hour for private parties.

Residents will forfeit a cleaning deposit for failure to clean up after a party (clubhouse and/or pool area) within a two-hour period.

Your ELE Pool Committee will do everything possible to ensure the residents will continue to enjoy the benefits of the clubhouse and pool facility. Any questions, comments, or concerns may be addressed to the committee at <u>pool@elehoa.org</u>.
